Short Film Competition on Arid Lands and Ancient Hydro-Technologies (AHTs)

The competition seeks short films that look to the past in search of solutions for the future.

Ancient Hydro-Technologies (AHTs) are time-tested water management solutions that did not just sustain civilizations for millennia, they created harmony between communities and their environments, preserved biodiversity, and fostered social bonds, particularly in the world's most arid regions.

The 2025 edition of the **Water Film Prize**, themed **"Back to Our Future"**, celebrates these ingenious water management technologies our ancestors developed over millennia.

Ancient Hydro-Technologies have played distinct roles throughout history:

Water Transportation: Qanats (Iran and North Africa), Karez System (China), Roman Aqueducts
Water Collection: Stepwells (India), Phoenician Cisterns (Malta)
Water Harvesting: Terraced irrigation systems (Peru), the Acequia Systems (New Mexico)
Water Retention: Johad (India), Sand Dams (East Africa)
Water Extraction: Sahduf (Sudan/Egypt) Persian Wheel (Pakistan India)

Water Film Prize 2025: a call for stories about Ancient Water Solutions for Present Climate Crisis

Submissions should provide a portrait of local geographies and address themes such as water conservation, climate resilience, biodiversity preservation, and/or social cohesion. Ideally, submitted films will also highlight their potential to inspire modern solutions.

By making short films one can inspire, inform, and promote action around water issues and solutions. The **Water Film Prize** challenges students, filmmakers, scientists and policy makers to explore these ancient water management methods not as historical artifacts, but as blueprints for tomorrow's innovations. Arid regions face mounting pressures from climate change, migration, and the abandonment of traditionally managed landscapes.

Submissions will be seen by a panel of film and water experts and stand a chance to win cash prizes! Students, filmmakers, artists, activists, hydrologists, ecologists, geographers, or social scientists can grab their cameras and share their water story with a global audience. Films can be **fiction, documentaries, or animation.**
